

Does your student need **medication** while at school or on a field trip (including overnight school trips)?

Here's what we need to make that possible:

1. A **Medication Consent Form** must be signed by a parent/guardian **and** the students' physician. The medication order needs to be specific (drug name/dose) **just like** a prescription is for a pharmacy. This is even for OTC (over the counter) meds such as Tylenol, Ibuprofen, Advil, Benadryl etc.
2. **Where to get a medication consent form:** the school web site (www.saukprairieschools.org), click on the "Family Resources" tab, under "Programs to Support Learning" on the right side click on "Health & Nursing" to locate the "Medication & Procedure Consent Form" or pick up from any school office.
3. The medication needs to be in a correctly labeled bottle.—one that matches the consent form.
4. When bringing an OTC (over the counter) med, be sure to keep it in the original container. Also be sure the medication has not expired.
5. The **only** meds students are allowed to carry are inhalers or Epipens when they have a Medication Consent Form on file **and** with a physician's approval to self-administer.
6. You will need a separate form for every medication.
7. Any medication should be brought to the school office by a parent or guardian, **not** sent with the student.
